Legislative Alert:

The Missouri Legislative session will be ending in just a few weeks. There are still several bills that need your attention. Of particular interest is HCS HB 2040 and 2430 -- Teacher Salary Bill. Several provisions were added to this bill that went beyond salary increases for teachers. One new provision of particular interest to the MARE association, is the attempt for the Joint Committee on Education to annually grant approval of the expenditure of professional development funds. MARE receives funding each year through this program to provide school board training, at several sites around the state. These professional development funds are also used to operate the Regional Professional Development Centers as well as many other support groups.

Please refer to the April 11, SAC Legislative Bulletin for a list of bills that need to be tracked now on a daily basis. You are encouraged to continue to contact your legislator to discuss concerns of many of the bills provisions.

Annual Election of Executive Board Members:

Below is listed the official announcement of the annual election of Executive Board Members to represent particular regions of the state.

No nominations have been received, to date, for Regions B, G, H and the at large board of education position. Nominations are still being taken for all the other open regions even though nominations have been received.

ANNUAL ELECTION OF EXECUTIVE BOARD MEMBERS

Missouri Association of Rural Education Executive Board Members shall serve two-year terms and are eligible for re-election. Elections or appointments shall be scheduled by the executive board with new executive board members taking office effective July 1, which is the beginning of the new fiscal year, and seated at the summer board meeting.

Members to be elected in **even** numbered years (2008) are:

- Five (5) members, one from each of the determined regions of the state: B, D, F, H, and J
- One (1) member from region "G" to complete one-year un-expired term (due to resignation).
- **One (1)** member from the board of education whose school is a member of MARE. (One position for a one-year un-expired term.)

REGIONAL OFFICERS

Interested Candidates may file, in writing, with the Executive Directors office, or rpatrick@moare.com. All Regional Candidates' names will be listed on a ballot in the order received and mailed to the member schools in the counties making up that particular region. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes will be declared elected to a two-year term.

Mr. Yancy Poorman of the North St. Francois Co. R-I School District is completing two-year term in **Region "B".**

Mrs. Geanine Bloch of the Stoutland R-II School District is completing two-year term in **Region "D"**. Mrs. Joan Twidwell of the La Monte R-IV School District is completing a two-year term in **Region "F"**.

Mr. Larry Flanagan of the Elsberry R-II School District is completing a two-year term in **Region "H"**. Dr. Francis Moran of the North Platte Co. R-I School District is completing a two-year term in **Region "J"**.

All are eligible for re-election with the exception of Region D and Region J representatives who will be retiring at the end of the current school year.

Candidates are being accepted to complete a one-year un-expired term representing Region "G".

 - Improving the economic development of rural communities by upgrading the education system to provide well-educated, skilled work force
