ECONOMIC

- Higher youth unemployment, Increasing state support, including decline of jobs fit for those with only HS degree
- Growth of "middle jobs" (requires training above HS diploma but below Bachelor's degree)
- Skills gap between High School preparedness and needs of today's 21st century labor market

POLICY

- Some employers willing to invest in future workforce (i.e. funding, internships, etc.)


EDUCATION




LMS Layout






Course Layout






Chapter Layout


