Angela Hanlin serves as the Principal at Matthews Elementary School which is part of the New Madrid County R-I School District in the Bootheel of Southeast Missouri. She has taught for 12 1/2 years, served as an instructional coach and curriculum coordinator for 3 1/2 years and is in her 5th year as Matthews Elementary Principal.
